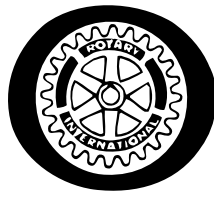

The economic development team aims to “grow Waco” by creating new jobs and increasing investment in Waco’s diverse economic sectors. Roberts’ team is responsible for business recruitment, expansions, market research and strategic development opportunities for the 238,000 population of the Greater Waco region.

Working with the Waco Industrial Foundation, Roberts manages acquisition, disposition and development of a \$38 million, 5,000 acre real estate portfolio. Under her leadership, the Foundation developed and implemented a successful master plan that led to record periods of sales, construction and acquisition.

Robert’s team received the International Economic Development Council Award in 2009 for multi-year development program. Roberts holds a BA in Entrepreneurship from Baylor University. She and her husband live in Waco and have one son.

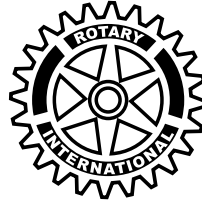
