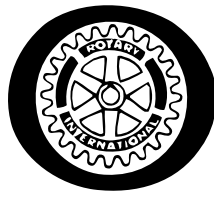

David M. Guinn attended Baylor University and majored in Political Science. He received his B.A. and J.D. from Baylor School of Law in 1963. He later attended the University of Michigan Law School where he received his LL.M. in International Law in 1966. He then returned to Baylor School of Law as an Assistant Professor and in 1976 was designated the Louise L. Morrison Professor of Constitutional Law.

Professor Guinn has now taught at Baylor School of Law for 39 years. During that period of time, he has assisted in the drafting of the Texas Administrative Procedures Act and has served on numerous advisory bodies in the State Bar and on numerous committees at Baylor University. He teaches courses in the areas of constitutional law, civil rights and local government.

Frankie Pack, Coordinator of Exhibits at the Mayborn Museum Complex, will present a program about the museum with special emphasis on this summer's fascinating traveling exhibit - *Wrapped in Tradition: The Chihuly Collection of American Indian Trade Blankets*.

Featured in the exhibit are 80 richly-patterned blankets in an amazing array of colors. All of the blankets showcased were used by European settlers for trade with American Indians in exchange for fur pelts, baskets, and other items of value.

The exhibit also includes 15 glass Navajo Blanket Cylinders created by a renowned studio glass artist, Dale Chihuly, who was inspired by the beauty of the blankets. Chihuly originated a new method of laying out glass threads into the desired pattern and then rolling molten glass over the pattern so that it fuses to the glass. The exhibit will be at the Mayborn through August 18.
