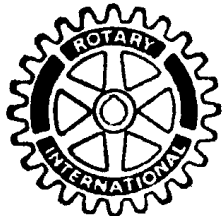

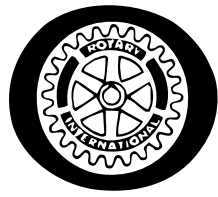

Rotary Foundation Committee seeks applicants for 2008-2009 Ambassadorial Scholarships

Application forms and information pertaining to The Rotary Foundation Ambassadorial Scholarships for study abroad during the 2008-2009 academic year are now on hand in your Rotary office. Rotarian Herb Bristow, Chairman of the club's Rotary Foundation Committee, asks that you help the Committee in its search for qualified applicants -- keeping in mind that Rotarians, their spouses, children, or grandchildren or their spouses are ineligible for the scholarships.

Rotary Foundation Ambassadorial Scholarships are available each year to men and women who would be outstanding ambassadors of good will for Rotary. All expenses up to \$23,000 including round-trip transportation costs are paid by The Rotary Foundation for the full academic year.

Applicants who are pursuing university studies must have completed at least two years of university coursework when the scholarships begin in 2008. Those interested in pursuing vocational studies must have a secondary school education and been employed in a recognized vocation for at least two years when the scholarships begin in 2008.

March 7, 2007 is the deadline date for the return of applications to be considered by the local Rotary Foundation Committee for the 2008-2009 awards, so ask your prospective applicant to contact the Rotary office immediately.
