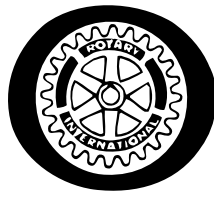

To promote academic achievement among the youth of this area, The Rotary Club of Waco during the 1966-67 Rotary year initiated a special project called challenge . This popular program was patterned after the popular College Quiz Bowl series of national television fame, which started on radio in 1953 and aired on national television from 1959-1970. Our Club brings before the local viewing audience teams representing the high schools of Waco and the Central Texas area. Since the aim of the program is to stimulate academic excellence and not comparisons between schools, the series is designed so that every team can be positively and favorably presented.

The format of the series calls for a team from two schools to compete weekly. During its first season of telecasts beginning in February, 1967, "Challenge '67" featured seven teams. "Challenge 2010" features 15 teams in this 43rd year of the series. Since the program started, over 660 teams comprised of 2,540 bright, sharp young men and women have represented the various Central Texas high schools. The club has invested over \$100,000 from its Rotary Youth Service Fund to support the popular "Challenge" series.

During the first few years of production, every participating school received book awards at the end of the season, with additional prizes going to the Grand Champion and Runner Up Teams. Cash awards now are presented to the Champion and Runner Up Teams for their school's library fund. The Champion Team receives an engraved Rotary trophy cup to keep for a year, and each team member and school sponsor receives a specially engraved Rotary medallion. Engraved medallions also are presented to all other participating team members and their school sponsors.

In May each year, the two top teams, their sponsors and school principals, plus a representative team member and the sponsor from the other participating schools are guests of the Challenge Committee at a special Challenge Awards luncheon meeting. Club members get to preview the tape of the Championship Match before it is telecast to the public. The project was recognized by Rotary International with a "Significant Achievement Award" in 1968, and featured in The Rotarian Magazine.

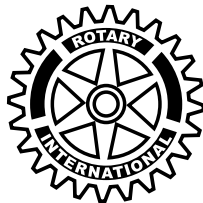
