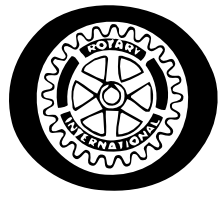

Would you be surprised to learn that it is the "Challenge" television series produced by the Challenge Committee of the Rotary Club of Waco? Patterned after the old "College Bowl" of early TV days, "Challenge" currently is celebrating its 40th year with "Challenge 2007." The youth project, designed to promote and encourage academic achievement among students in Central Texas high schools, started in 1967 with teams from seven area high schools. The next year it was recognized by Rotary International with a "Significant Achievement Award," and was featured in THE ROTARIAN Magazine. This year, sixteen high schools are participating, and

Central Texas viewers are able to see the series on Saturday afternoons on KCEN-TV Channel 6 from 5:00-5:30.

During the past 40 years, the popular "Challenge" series has featured 2,456 outstanding young men and women of our area competing on 614 teams. The Rotary Club of Waco has invested over \$92,000 in this award-winning project from the Rotary Youth Service Fund, Inc., which you have supported with your tax-deductible contributions.

A.J. Moore Academy is Waco Independent School District's magnet high school offering specialized courses of study in business, engineering and technology.
