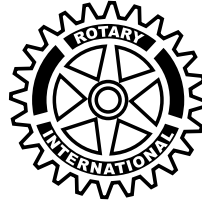

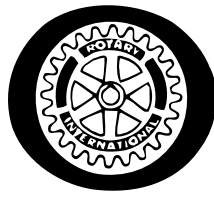

Jo Anne Brooks, born and raised in Dallas, is a survivor of polio, which left both of her arms and one of her hands paralyzed at the age of four. She uses her feet to assist her unaffected hand in accomplishing just about any task she attempts.

Jo Anne retired in 2008 after 30 years as a Federal Probation Officer in Laredo. She is now spending her time designing and making jewelry, teaching jewelry-making classes with a motivational message, participating in fund raisers for the arts and disabilities, and speaking to groups about polio, disability and her life story. She recently was featured in a segment of "Texas Country Report," and her jewelry design has won awards in jewelry art competitions..

Jo Anne is married, and has a daughter who is a graduate of the Air Force Academy and is now a 1st Lieutenant; and a son, who recently was graduated from North Texas State University. Besides making jewelry, she enjoys snow skiing, horseback riding, hiking, tricycling, gardening and cooking. She lives in Laredo, and has a second home with a studio in Utopia, Texas.

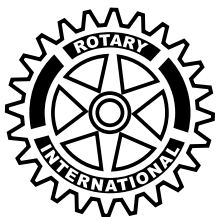
