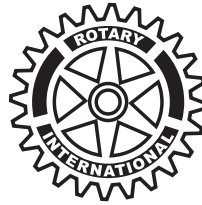

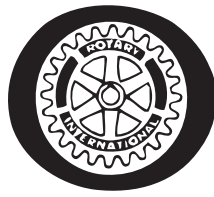

Vicki Patterson, Clinical Research Coordinator for the Mind-Body Medicine Research Laboratory, has been with the organization since shortly after its move to Baylor. Dr. Gary Elkins founded the MBMR program at Scott & White in 2002 soon after the results of the 1991 Women's Health Initiative were published, indicating a need for more varied research involving women's health issues.

The program has been at Baylor since 2001 and is a part of the Psychology & Neuroscience Department in the College of Arts and Sciences. Prior to taking the position of CRC for this lab, Vicki worked as a Lab Associate in the Health and Human Performance and Recreation Lab at Baylor in the School of Education.

Kim Mulkey

Kim Mulkey is the head women's basketball coach at Baylor University. Kim led her Hammond High School basketball team to four consecutive state championships; is the first person in NCAA history to win a basketball national championship as a player, assistant coach, and head coach; was an All-American point guard at Louisiana Tech University in two national championships. Claimed the AIA W title in 1981, the inaugural NCAA title in 1982 and in 1984 was the inaugural winner of the women's version of the Frances Pomeroy Naismith Award. Mulkey was also a member of the gold medal-winning U.S. Women's Basketball team at the 1984 Summer Olympics. In 1985, she started her career with Tech.

In 2000, Mulkey took over a Baylor program that had finished the 1999-2000 season 7-20 and last in the Big 12 Conference. In her first season at Baylor, she led the Lady Bears program to its first NCAA tournament bid. The Lady Bears have, as of 2009 put together nine consecutive 20-win seasons and only once has the team lost more than 10 games in a season. The rise of the Baylor program under Mulkey was highlighted in 2005 with a national title. This made her the first woman to have won NCAA Division 1 basketball titles as a player and head coach.

Since the inception of the NCAA women's tournament in 1982, Mulkey has been involved in that tournament as a either a player or coach every year except 1985 and 2003, She was enshrined in the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame in 2000 for her accomplishments as a player. In 2007, Mulkey signed a 10-year extension to remain Baylor's coach. Her autobiography is called Won't Back Down: Teams, Dreams and Family.

It is always good to have a former member return, and we are so happy to re-welcome David Stanley to the Rotary Club of Waco!

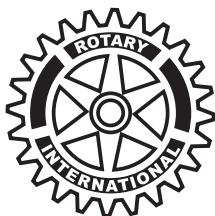
