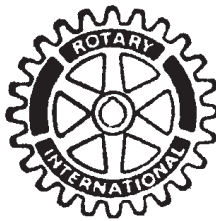

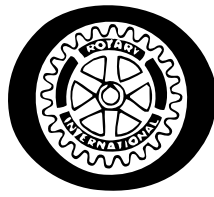

Rotarian Ellie Caston, Director of the Mayborn Museum Complex at Baylor University, steps up to the Rotary lectern to tell us about the latest developments at Waco's exciting Mammoth site. Baylor University has been involved in the scientific research, excavations, and preservation of the site since it was first discovered in 1978. Partnering with the City of Waco, the site is now poised to become part of the National Park Service.

Born in Houston, Ellie received her BFA degree from Southern Methodist University and both her Master's degree in Museum Studies and her PhD in Fine Arts from Texas Tech University. She served as Educator with the Carnegie

Museum in Pittsburgh, Pa., and was Director of the Virginia Association of Museums in Richmond. Prior to coming to Baylor in 1997, Ellie was Director of the Gregg County Historical Museum in Longview, Texas. She is a past president of the Texas Association of Museums.

Ellie and her husband Al Bjelland are the parents of two married children and proud grandparents of four exceptional youngsters, and they attend St. Paul's Episcopal Church.

As we all know, Kim is the head women's basketball coach for Baylor University. But, did you know she was the first person in NCAA history to win a basketball national championship as a player, assistant coach, and head coach? Other accomplishments are: one of the first girls to play organized basketball as an equal with boys, led her high school to four consecutive championships, point guard in college winning two national championships, member of the gold medal winning team of the '84 Summer Olympics, and the list goes on!

In 1985 she became the assistant coach for Texas Tech before being promoted in '96 to associate coach. Then Baylor recruited her in 2000 where Kim turned the program around. Today, Baylor has enjoyed nine consecutive seasons of 20+ wins!

Since the inception of NCAA women's tournament in 1982, Mulkey has been involved in that tournament as a player or coach every year except two and in 2000, was enshrined in the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame for her accomplishments as a player!

Kim Mulkey, Baylor's Women's Basketball Coach - and an inspiration to all. Waco is glad to have her as one of our own!

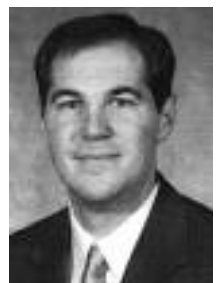

Drew graduated from Butler University to assume an assistant coaching position with Valparaiso University. He spent nine years in this position until moving into the head coach's position where he won the regular season conference championship. He was later nominated to become one of Valparaiso University's 150 Most Influential People in the University's history.

On August 22, 2003, he took the head coaching position for the men's basketball team. With an inherited program and a team severely handicapped from the previous coach's problems, Drew still led the Bears to an 8-21 season. By 2007, Drew had turned the program around to finish 21-9 in regular season and ranked

4th in the Big 12. It was enough to make the NCAA Tournament. After that season, he drew a 10-year contract with Baylor as head coach of the Bears.

Prior to the 2008-09 season, a Rival.com writer called Drew a "coach on the rise" due to his ability and success attracting top-quality talent to Baylor's basketball program.

# CONGRATULATIONS ON FIFTY YEARS OF ROTARY MEMBERSHIP, PAUL D. MARABLE, JR.

In recognition of his fifty years of Rotary membership, Past President Paul D. Marable, Jr. received his 50-year pin and certificate last month from President Judge Ralph T. Strother.

Paul first entered Rotary in Denison, Texas in 1949 when he was appointed Chamber Manager there after serving three years as manager of Waco Chamber's membership, convention, information and retail departments. From Denison, he went to Abilene to manage the West Texas Chamber of Commerce for nine years before returning to Waco as General Manager of the Waco Chamber of Commerce. In 1976, Paul joined First Federal Savings and Loan as its Executive Vice President, and at the time of his retirement, was its President and Vice Chairman of the Board.

Paul entered the Rotary Club of Waco on September 25, 1961 with the classification on ASSOCIATIONS; was elected to serve eleven different terms on the club's

Board of Directors; served as Secretary-Treasurer and Chairman of the Program Committee in 1970-71, Vice President in 1970-71 and as President during 1972-73. He was Editor of FELL-O-SHIP in 1976-77, and for the past nine years chaired the club's important Rotary Information Committee, where he continues to serve as a member.

He served on the District's Group Study Exchange Committee during 1973-74, and was its Chairman in 1974-75 for the District's first Group Study Exchange project, when a Team from our District exchanged visits with a Team from District 310 in India.

Paul was named by our club to the prestigious District Roll of Fame in 1978, and again served the District as a District Governor's Special Group Representative for 1979-80. In 1988, he became a Paul Harris Fellow of The Rotary Foundation.

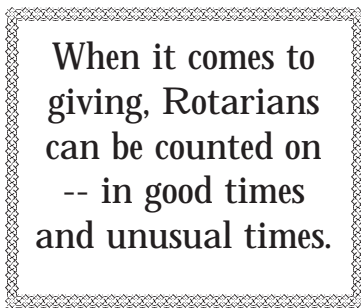
