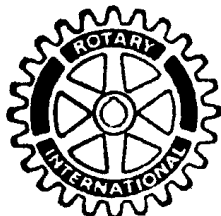

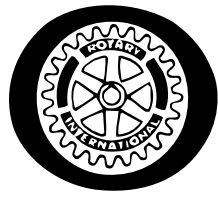

Past President Monsignor Deering was born in Rathvilly, County Carlow, Ireland to Patrick and Mary Ellen Dowling Deering in 1921. He attended Kierans College in Ireland and was ordained at Kilkenny, Ireland in June, 1953. At the invitation of a family friend, Monsignor Deering came to Waco in July 1953, intending to stay only a short while. But Bishop Louis J. Reicher put him to work almost immediately as assistant to Monsignor John J. Kearns and shortly after that asked him to begin the Regis Center. Monsignor Deering became a United States citizen in 1959 and was named pastor of St. Louis parish in 1964.

In his five-plus decades of service to Waco and Central Texas, Monsignor Deering has been President of the Waco Ministerial Alliance, Waco Conference of Christians and Jews, and President of Rotary Club of Waco. He has served on many local boards and established the Mark Deering Scholarship Foundation, providing scholarships for deserving youth.

Perhaps no other member of Rotary Club of Waco can claim as many makeups from distant lands as Monsignor Deering. Whether he is just back from India, Poland, Portugal, England or his native Ireland, his reports of "Rotary Around the World" are always informative and entertaining.

She is the first person, man or woman, to win a basketball national championship as a player, assistant coach, and head coach. Coach Mulkey has led the Lady Bears into post-season play each of her six years at BU, including three back to back Sweet 16 appearances.

In addition to her position as the Head Coach of the women's basketball program, she is very active in and around the Waco community, donating both her time and money to various activities and charities.

All of the hard work, prestige and acclaim, however, pale in comparison to the priorities in her life - her two children, Makenzie and Kramer. Likewise, this mom schedules all of her personal time around the children's school and sports activities, often planning her day around a school lunch period or award program or spending countless hours supporting them at their own practices and games.

On August 22, 2003, Scott Drew took over one of the most daunting rebuilding projects in collegiate basketball history when he assumed the head coaching position at Baylor University. Two years into his Baylor tenure, basketball followers nationwide have recognized Drew's accomplishments under unprecedented circumstances as he and his staff have quietly served notice that Baylor basketball is on the rise.

"Scott Drew is one of the bright young ones in our coaching fraternity. I'm impressed with the relationship he has with his players. He is a great teacher. He is the kind of guy that you want to have your son play for," said Mike Brey, Notre Dame head coach.

Drew, at 34 one of the youngest head coaches in Division I basketball, has long been considered a top-level national recruiter. That reputation was evidenced quickly at Baylor when his first two recruiting classes were rated 10th and 16th, respectively, in the nation. The two classes are widely considered the best back-to-back groups of basketball recruits ever to sign with Baylor.

Drew and his teams have made a positive impression on the court as well. In his first season at Baylor, Drew and his overachieving Bears finished the season 8-21 and won over the hearts of Baylor fans and basketball fans alike with their scrappy play and no-quit attitudes. The team exceeded all expectations and Drew was praised for his efforts and mentioned in Big 12 Coach of the Year discussions.

A 1993 graduate of Baylor University with a Bachelor of Liberal Arts degree, Drew earned a master's degree from Valparaiso in 1994. Drew and his wife Kelly are the parents of one daughter, Mackenzie.

6. CONTINUING EDUCATION -- Each week at Rotary there is a program designed to keep one informed ... different speakers, different topics.
