

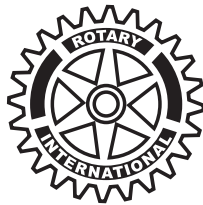

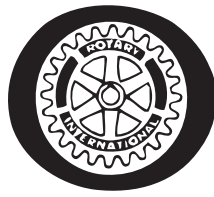

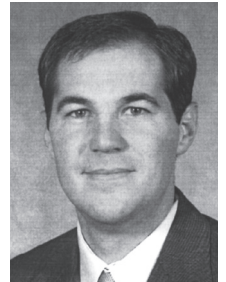

On August 22, 2003 Scott Drew assumed the head coaching position at Baylor University and took over one of the most harrowing rebuilding projects in collegiate history. In the last three seasons, Baylor has risen to national prominence after three consecutive 20-win seasons and three straight postseason appearances, including advancing to the Elite Eight for the first time in Baylor's history. He was named 2010 Division 1 Men's Coach of the Year in the state of Texas by the Texas Association of Basketball Coaches.

Coach Scott Drew came to Baylor after coaching a decade at Valparaiso, the final year as head coach. The previous nine seasons, he served as an assistant under his father, the legendary Homer Drew.

Drew is a former vice president for the NABC Assistant Coaches Committee and previously served on the National Invitation Tournament committee. Drew and his wife Kelly are the parents of one daughter, Mackenzie, and one son, Peyton.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

Upon the recommendation of the Board of Directors, the following amendment to Article 5, Section 2 of the club's Bylaws will be presented for action at the club's regular meeting on September 13, 2010.

ARTICLE 5

Section 2—The membership dues shall be \$365.00 per annum, payable annually or semi-annually, in advance, with the understanding that the member's subscription to THE ROTARIAN Magazine and the annual per capita dues to the District shall be paid from the annual dues.

Upon approval, the amendment will be effective October 1, 2010.

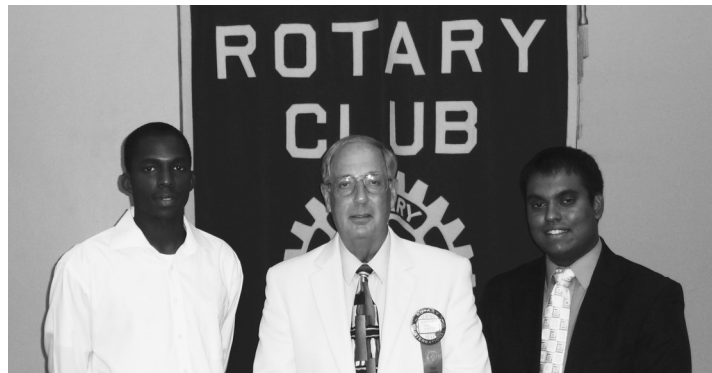
Waco Rotarians always are generous with their support of the club's youth activities, and Holly and the Committee members want to let you know in advance that they appreciate you.

Your Rotary Club Scholarship Fund was established 55 years ago to provide scholarships to one or more deserving students who are permanent residents of McLennan County and are classified as juniors or seniors in college. Since that time, 152 young men and women have received awards totaling \$134,410 from the Fund. These recipients have attended 22 different universities and colleges throughout the country.

Application forms for the Waco Rotary Club Scholarship are available each year during the month of June, and are due before July 1st. The basis for the awards are: grades, need, self- help, college major, citizenship and activated—all of equal importance in the selection process by the Scholarship Committee. Relatives of Rotarians are eligible to apply. Applicants are interviewed by the Scholarship Committee on a set date in July, after which the club's Board of Directors receives the Committee's recommendation for approval.
