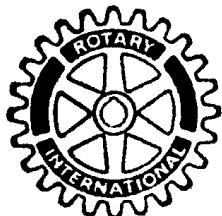

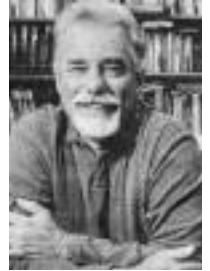

The Waco Rotary Club Scholarship Fund was established 51 years ago to provide scholarships to one or more deserving students who are permanent residents of McLennan County and are classified as juniors or seniors in college. Since that time, 139 young men and women have received awards totaling \$114,410 from the Fund. These recipients have attended 22 different universities and colleges throughout the country.

Application forms are available each year during the month of June, and due before July 1st. Relatives of Rotarians are eligible to apply. Applicants are interviewed by the Scholarship Committee on a set date in July, after which the club's Board of Directors receives the Committee's recommendation.

### **IMPORTANT NOTICE**

To cope with a \$4.00 per member increase in annual dues to District 5870 (from \$16 to \$20 effective July 1, 2006) plus a \$1.00 increase in Rotary International dues for each new member who enters the club after July 1 and January 1 (from \$9.75 to \$10.75), your Board of Directors was faced with a dilemma to approve a balanced Budget for 2006-2007.

After much discussion at its July and August meetings, the Board decided to recommend to the membership a \$5.00 increase in annual dues.

Upon the recommendation of the Board of Directors, the following amendment to Article 5, section 2 of the club's Bylaws will be presented for your action at the club's regular meeting on September 18, 2006.

#### ARTICLE 5

*Section 2-- The membership dues shall be \$305.00 per annum, payable annually or semi-annually, in advance; with the understanding that the member's subscription to THE ROTARIAN Magazine and the annual per capita dues payable to the District shall be paid from the annual dues.*

Upon approval, the amendment will be effective October 1, 2006.

### FOR YOUR INFORMATION ...

This past July, your club paid ...

- \$20.00 per member to District 5870 for annual District dues
- \$23.50 per member to Rotary International for semiannual International dues
- \$10.75 international dues for each new member entering the club after January 1, 2006;
- \$1.00 per member to Rotary International for an annual levy for the Council on Legislation
- \$2.74 per member to Rotary International for annual liability insurance assessment; and
- \$6.00 per member to Rotary International for semiannual subscriptions to *THE ROTARIAN* Magazine.

Based on the July 1, 2006 membership count of 342, the club paid \$6,840 to District 5870 and \$11,510.58 to Rotary International -- a total of \$18,350.58.

In January 2007, the club will pay Rotary International another \$23.50 per member for semiannual international dues and \$6.00 per member for semiannual subscriptions to *THE ROTARIAN* Magazine based on its January 1, 2007 membership count, plus an additional \$10.75 for each new member entering after July 1, 2006.
